Admission Requirements

Pre-Nursing High School Applicants

Students wishing to begin their nursing education may choose to enter the freshman Pre-Nursing program at either the Uptown Campus or Clermont College.

Pre-Nursing Admission Criteria

- 1. Graduation from an accredited high school or preparatory school.*
- 2. Successful completion of 16 units of college preparatory subject units: English-4; Biology-1; Chemistry-1; College-prep Mathematics-3; Social Sciences-2; Fine Arts-1; additional college preparatory subjects-4. Recommended: physics, foreign language, anatomy & physiology or a third unit in social science with a "C" or better in all required courses.

Admission to the Pre-Nursing Program is based on an applicant's high school class rank, ACT and/or SAT scores, and grade point average.

Freshmen may be admitted for General Admission or as Academic Scholars. Academic Scholars are guaranteed admission to the BSN nursing program if they maintain grades of "C" in all required pre-nursing courses with a GPA of 3.0 in these courses.

* UC Clermont's open admission policy means that any high school graduate will be accepted into Clermont College's Pre-Nursing program regardless of the classes taken in high school. Non-graduates can qualify by providing GED scores.

Uptown & Clermont College BSN Program Sites

Upon admission to the BSN program, students may elect to complete their nursing courses at the Uptown Campus or our satellite program at Clermont College, located in Batavia, Ohio. Some clinical sites include Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center, Mercy Anderson, Mercy Clermont and University Hospital.

Transfer Students

Transfer students wishing to enter pre-nursing must show evidence of grade point averages of at least 3.0 or better in current college courses.
